WHY?

Whilst PSHE education should follow a planned programme, we recognise that PSHE and Citizenship provide the space and opportunities that can provide timely support for children and young people when things are happening in our world that are difficult and upsetting.

You will have already received a <u>letter</u> from the Secretary of State for Education, Gillian Keegan, Minister for Schools, Nick Gibb and Minister for Skills, Apprenticeships and Higher Education, Robert Halfon to provide advice to schools and colleges about the terrorist attacks in Israel. The Home Office has also provided <u>guidance</u> for education settings in how to respond to potentially radical comments being made.

We wanted to provide further advice and resources that we have sourced, and are grateful to Stoke-on-Trent City Council's Community Cohesion Team for their support in sharing some of the resources below.

BEST PRACTICE - SAFE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

It is important that we create a safe learning environment to support children and young people to engage with the news safely.
